QUARTERLY PONTEFRACT MEETING WITH WAKEFIELD COUNCIL

On 2 October, Phil Cook and I met in Wakefield with elected members and a number of senior managers from relevant departments.

There remains much on a Pontefract Action Plan which remains unfunded and unresourced.

Here's what we did learn:

- Horsefair 'Streets for People' – completion due March 2026
- Horsefair House – Vico Homes are not interested in taking this asset
- Horsefair Flats – Vico Homes phase 1 demolition completion by Dec 2025
- Purple Flag report – had not been shared with us

- Arts Council funding – awaiting announcement
- No response to town hall matters (cupola, general maintenance, and proposal for use of the Safe Space)
- Towns & City team business support event to run in Pontefract
- Design Codes consultation report due 20 Nov
- Former swimming pool site sold subject to contract for roadside retail use




- No news on former Harratt's site planning application
- Streetscene department is now split into two teams (Environmental Services and Street Cleaning)
- A debate took place on the risks of planning applications for apartments being approved which end up as HMOs
- Potential for 100 homes on former hospital site
- Improvements to Pontefract Park highways approach to Huggamug to be discussed by Pontefract Park Steering Group (on which we are not represented). Also, Jubilee Wood sign promised
- Friarwood Valley Gardens walls and railing raised for discussion again
- Pedestrian precinct bollards 'go live' sometime in November, though Beastfair remains incomplete
- Traffic speeds around the immediate vicinity of the town centre discussed (Jubilee Way and highways with stone setts)
- Highways lack of gulley clearance; this is part of a districtwide 3-year plan
- Buddleia growing from buildings
- St Giles Church clock – to be followed up
- Travellers illegally occupying land near Squash Club
- Town Hall union flag to be replaced

VICE CHAIR'S REPORT

AED - LARKS HILL AND OTHER NEWS

Since last year when we ran the AED fundraising project, we are pleased to announce that the defibrillators have been deployed a total of 30 times so far this year.



A deployment doesn't mean used, it means deployed if needed as a precaution. Fortunately, they haven't been used once but have been there if needed. The table give details of activity for each one. In September I arranged for Larks Hill School to be used for the latest awareness session which was run by YAS for the Larks Hill residents. The event saw 28 residents attend along with Alan Thistlewood (is this spelling correct) who is the Larks Hill scheme co-ordinator. Alan and I are looking to install a second defibrillator if a suitable location can be found in the Larks Hill area.



BREAST CANCER SUPPORT

I attended a wedding last October in Bawtry where I was surprised to see bras hanging out in the street and in shop windows.



I found out that it was to raise awareness for "Pink October" the Breast Cancer support organisation; the light bulb went on as I realised that working with the Decoration Squad this could be something that would be put to good effect in Pontefract. I then approached Rachael Brown who runs

"Pontefract & District Breast Cancer Support Group" (one of our community group members) and the idea was pitched; Rachael agreed it would be beneficial for the group to be involved (especially as there are family members in the group) and a plan was made.



A Facebook page was set up to coordinate collection points for the bras, and I attended a couple of the group's meetings showing how to fasten the bras together to make them into bunting, also how to mount the flags onto the poles that the Decoration Squad would provide. The bras were collected and connected together ready for the day to mount

them. Chris Taylor, MD of Tracked Spider Solutions, one of our business members and also part of the Decoration Squad was asked to help to gain the height needed allowing for delivery wagon clearance. Rachael then coordinated her group members and husbands to meet with Chris and I to make Pontefract pink! Some of the group members continued to decorate over the following days, ensuring every available space was covered.

We're sure you will agree it has made an impact and raised everyone's awareness about breast cancer, with the town and group being featured on radio and in other media. Only one question remains, what happens next year?

NEW TEACHING BLOCK AT CARLETON HIGH SCHOOL

Paul Cartwright and Phil Cook were pleased to attend the opening ceremony and site tour on Fri 26 Sept of the new teaching block at Carleton High School, which was officially opened by Yvette Cooper, MP.



With the exception of sport, music and drama, all other subjects have now moved location from the previous collection of temporary and permanent buildings into this new state-of-the-art eco-designed block with the support of the Department for Education.

Before the ceremony and tour, we heard from a series of speakers, Julian Appleyard (Pontefract Academies Trust CEO), Shaheen Shariff (Head), plus representatives from the lead contractor Morgan Sindall.



The project is true investment in the community of students and staff.

WORKING GROUP REPORTS

HIGHWAYS GROUP

Although now a small group we continue to meet in advance of an on-line meeting in November with Wakefield Council Transportation officers.

Council Transportation officers.

The following current highway issues are ones which the group have been considering:

- **The South Featherstone Link Road** – This is a long-term project with pressure to allow access to South Featherstone for housing development and the need to relieve traffic congestion through Featherstone. Current work is progressing on a southern link road between the War Horse and the Crematorium.
- The West Yorkshire Combined Authority A639 **Leeds to Pontefract Corridor Improvement scheme** including the provision of a pedestrian crossing at Pontefract Park entrance and improved cycle routes in the park will not be delivered until 2027.
- With the change of builder, we await the start on house building on the former **Parkside Hotel** site, including the provision of the agreed roundabout access off the A639.
- **Wakefield Council Streetscene** scheme in Pontefract Park is completed with the redesign of the roundabout and improvements to the access road to the central car park, which has been closed because of problems with the racetrack crossing.
- The implementation of '**The Streets for People**' scheme in Horsefair is well underway with Finkle Street now one way and Vico homes have demolished the Horsefair flats. We will be monitoring the effects of this scheme as it progresses.



- The Harworth Estates have indicated that there is no intention to provide a disabled friendly pedestrian link between the **Prince of Wales Park** housing development and the footpath to Colonels Walk.



- Work is underway to replace the **rising bollards** which protect the town centre traffic-free precinct.
- The Highways Agency have confirmed that the roadworks on the **A1 and Went Edge Road bridge** should be complete by mid-December.



- We will monitor the effects of current house building which is well underway on Skinner Lane and between Hardwick Road and Ackworth Road.
- Concern remains about the adverse effects on traffic on Park Road caused by visitors to McDonalds.

Our Group will continue to meet regularly, and we welcome the continuing relationship with WMDC Council officers.

We would be pleased to welcome anyone who is interested in joining us.

RAIL GROUP

The Rail Group continues to meet about every six or seven weeks.

We have successfully recruited a new Coordinator to lead the Group. Members continue to maintain contact with Northern Rail, the West Yorkshire Combined Authority and Grand Central discussing future timetables and our aspirations to improve our connectivity to the wider rail network beyond the County Boundary at Knottingley towards Doncaster and Goole in the East Riding as well as Sheffield and York. In the summer we met Yvette Cooper MP.

As members of Railfuture, group members attend and contribute to their regular Yorkshire Branch meetings, their on-line webinars and articles in 'The Yorkshire Rail Campaigner'. Our membership of The Community Rail Partnership and the Northern Station adoption schemes give us opportunities to improve our stations including learning from other station adoption schemes in our area.

The following reflect our current activities:

- The artwork completed by a group of New College students for display by Northern at **Tanshelf station**, as part of their Rail 200 celebrations, has not yet been displayed. We will be meeting with New College students after the October half-term break to progress this project.
- We have maintained our support for the Friends of Askern Station project to reopen **Askern Station** which is seen by the South Yorkshire Combined Authority Mayor only as aspirational.
- We have continued to lobby for improvements to the service between Sheffield and York through Baghill and are pleased to see the restoration of a Sunday service from December.

- **Baghill Station Building** – Cllr Mayhew maintains contact with The Arch Company over the condition of the building. We continue to investigate possible funding opportunities but the need to identify a potential user for the building remains critical.



- From December we welcome the improvements to Grand Central journeys calling at Monkhill including on Sundays. Regrettably, this comes with the loss of the day return facility to London on Saturdays.



- As part of our wish to improve and learn from other station adoption groups we have met with the Friends of Wakefield Kirkgate station and visited the Friends of Batley Station. We will continue to build on these important links.

Our meetings will continue throughout this year and into 2026. Anyone interested in rail services locally is always welcome to join our Group.



- We are still waiting for news on the installation of lifts, the new footbridge and other improvements at **Monkhill Station** which are to be delivered by Northern. Wakefield Council and Yvette Cooper MP are involved in discussions with Northern.




PONTEFRACT TOWN CRIER

FRIENDS OF FRIARWOOD VALLEY GARDENS

Friarwood Valley Gardens was given the prestigious gold award for the second successive year at Yorkshire in Bloom's award ceremony in Tadcaster in September.



The Yorkshire in Bloom judge had visited in July and the report of the visit noted that "The group (Friends of Friarwood Valley Gardens) were proud and enthusiastic to showcase

all elements of the park commenting on past achievements as well as recent new initiatives such as the newly erected archway at the entrance to the park and the engraved liquorice poem panel." The report concluded: "Overall, a wonderful green space only minutes away from the town centre which offers a peaceful and usable space in equal measures."

Despite the long hot summer and hosepipe ban, the Friends maintained the flower beds and rose garden and kept them looking good for visitors to the Valley Gardens, and to achieve the gold award. Our volunteers have been active throughout the year with maintenance of the gardens and we are always looking for new members. Two successful events were held in August: our usual Yorkshire Day family gala on 1st August, and Friarwood Festival on 9th August for which all 4000 tickets were sold. Friarwood Festival has been an annual event for seven years, showcasing local bands and also providing an affordable fun day for the whole family. Although Friarwood Festival is not primarily a fund raising venture, all surplus funds go towards improvements in the Valley Gardens. Over the last few years it has funded tree sculptures, a thermoplastic play trail, the commemorative Crown Bed for the late Queen's Platinum Jubilee and King Charles' Coronation, and this year additional play equipment for the playground. The group also received grants from Wakefield Council's Neighbourhood Improvement Fund towards the costs of the Yorkshire Day event and new litter picking equipment.

PONTEFRACT IN BLOOM

The summer 2025 display comprised 16 tiered planters, 11 square planters, 33 hanging baskets, and the two Jubilee Planters outside the Museum.

Our decision to use nonstop begonias in most of our planters has proved to be a good choice, providing good displays well into October. Pontefract in Bloom also facilitated the



planting of flower beds in Pontefract Park, Friarwood Valley Gardens and St Giles' Church, working together with the respective community groups. As in previous years, Day Opportunities at Thornes Park grew the bedding plants for us. Day Opportunities supports individuals with learning disabilities to develop their skills to become more independent. The total annual cost of delivering Pontefract in Bloom is nearly £10,000,

funded by grants from Wakefield Council's Neighbourhood Improvement Fund and Vico (formerly Wakefield District Housing) and sponsorship from local businesses, community groups and individuals.

FRIENDS OF PONTEFRACT PARK

Friends of Pontefract Park were pleased that the park's Green Flag status was renewed following a review visit in April.

The group continues with the weekly litter picking session on Wednesday mornings at 10am, and maintains a unit in the foyer of Aspire for opportunistic litter picking. The lakeside rowing boat planters have been replaced by three large raised beds, constructed from sleepers which have been planted with perennials for easier maintenance. The group also continues to maintain the two large flower beds near the mini-roundabout. Friends of Pontefract Park has received two grants from Wakefield Council's Neighbourhood Improvement Fund this year for the costs of planting and the new raised beds.






