Nominations celebrated for the King's Award for Voluntary Service



In 2023, we were pleased to be nominated for the King's Award for Voluntary Service with the help of Dwain Longley, a process which is locally managed by the West Yorkshire Lieutenant's office.

Following an extensive assessment and interview process, the third-party nomination was approved. Those submissions then go to a panel of national assessors who recommend a shortlist for Royal approval. Award winners are then announced on 14 Nov, 2024.

All the West Yorkshire organisations proposed by the Lord-Lieutenant, Ed Anderson, and his team, were invited to Bowcliffe Hall on 29 April for a celebratory event, at which our chair, Paul Cartwright and John Turner had the pleasure of attending, where they heard some great stories from other volunteers of all ages. We were the only civic society to be represented, so we were both humbled and proud in getting this far for Pontefract.

Trophies for schools

Pontefract Civic Society hosted a short presentation for budding artists that had taken part from St Giles Academy, The King's School, Halfpenny Lane and Orchard Head, and one winner from each school was presented with a trophy.

Civic Society Chair, Paul Cartwright, said; ***this activity was open to all Pontefract schools in our membership and it allowed students to get their message across in a colourful way including their own slogan. This engenders civic pride to make Pontefract a better place whilst encouraging people to recycle and care for the planet.***

Chair's Report

Let me start this report by saying I continue to be frustrated by Wakefield Council's lack of action in safely managing Pontefract precinct.

This is an unusual step that I am taking in publicly saying, that the council should not take our relationship for granted; as the council leader says, we are "your critical friend".

We have raised this worsening situation for years since the failure of the bollards system - not just in Pontefract, but across the district. It worries me that replacement costs will be high for the various towns and the city, and will Pontefract be prioritised as was promised two years ago by Cllr Morley?

We have seen a continual increase of blatant abuse of traffic regulations, which we are told lies with the council to enforce, but no enforcement has been evident?

What have we done?

- On the advice of the police, we've asked for a change in signage, which has been rejected.
- We've asked for temporary barriers to be added to deter abuse, which has in the main been ignored.
- We've asked for council departments and the police to work together on this issue, which hasn't happened.
- We've routinely submitted photographs of offending vehicles to Wakefield Council, to no effect.

The thing is, the problem remains, and we are not going away. We will continue to apply pressure to council officers, and we expect elected members to support us in this campaign against breaches of highways regulations in the interests of public safety.

This we found very disappointing, which has now left a gap in monitoring actions and raising new issues for Pontefract from the previous meeting in February through to the next meeting in July.

Paul Cartwright and John Turner represented Pontefract Civic Society and both felt the event was an inspiring & enjoyable convention, hosted by YHACS and Wakefield Civic Society at CAPA College.

We had a great line up of speakers, including Paul who closed the morning session on 'activating Pontefract town centre'. All speakers talked about heritage & culture in regeneration, high streets, the public realm, green spaces, and fun events - all supported by the civic movement, partnerships, funders, stakeholders and artists.

The afternoon got off to a bang with CAPA College students performing from musicals, all of whom were great; the first young man was phenomenal.

This was a successful and worthwhile day.

De Lacy Primary School is 'Outstanding'

De Lacy Primary School, part of Pontefract Academies Trust, has been praised by Ofsted as an 'Outstanding' school in all five inspected categories – the quality of education, behaviour and attitudes, personal development, leadership and management and early years provision.

The whole school community is celebrating after inspectors, who visited on 12 and 13 March 2024, praised De Lacy Primary as an 'exceptional school with happy pupils.' Inspectors went on to commend the school's extremely 'ambitious curriculum that carefully identifies what pupils should learn over time', coupled with 'leaders who cleverly weave knowledge and skills throughout different subjects'. During their visit, Ofsted's inspection team praised the school which 'places as much importance on character

development as it does on achievement' and in turn gives pupils 'access to an impressive range of high-calibre opportunities and activities.'

Commending pupils' behaviour and attitudes, inspectors acknowledged pupils' 'high levels of independence' and noted that 'they are polite and respectful towards each other and adults' and 'they are role models for each other.'

On the ambitious and supportive culture of the school, the report states that 'the school is determined that every pupil will have a bright and positive future.'

Inspectors concluded that 'Leaders at all levels, including trust leaders, have a clear, shared vision for the school. They realise this vision through taking considered actions that support staff and enable constant improvement.'

James Parkinson, Headteacher at De Lacy Primary School, said; *"I take immense pride in the results of our inspection. It is an honour to say that our pupils benefit from an 'outstanding' education, laying a strong foundation for their transition to secondary education. The commitment of our staff and the broader trust community empowers pupils to widen their horizons and be well-prepared for the next chapter in their lives."*

We are pleased to announce that we have been awarded £5,000 from WYMCA's allocation of Levelling Up money in the UK Shared Prosperity Fund.

The project will start with public engagement towards research into Pontefractians, especially women, worthy of having a blue plaque erected in Pontefract. If you've got a story of someone notable in your family, who has made a difference in the town, then get in touch with Paul.

We have also just launched an A5 flyer aimed at group organisers who wish to have a **Guided Heritage Walk** in Pontefract. This was launched at The Yorkshire Society's Heritage Summit at Hull Minster in May, with the aspiration of providing group tours of various lengths from an hour to half a day or longer, which we can manage by working with other partner organisations and key sites, such as St Giles Church, Pontefract Museum and Pontefract Castle.

On Friday 17 May, our heritage group members attended Wakefield Council's **Heritage Showcase** at Pontefract Library, which was the last in a districtwide series of



similar events to promote local heritage groups. This forms part of the council's National Lottery Heritage funded two year project, which sees the council employ a Heritage Development Manager, where Paul Cartwright and representatives from four other community groups participated with candidates for a panel discussion during the interview process.

The following week, on Friday 24 May, Paul Cartwright, Phil Cook and John Turner went to Wakefield Town Hall along with a number of heritage groups for the launch of the **Heritage Framework**, which we had contributed to in a workshop with Heritage Lincolnshire last year.

Paul was invited to deliver a presentation on our work in the heritage field, and what we do for citizens, businesses, schools and visitors in Pontefract – though a rich variety of techniques and events which are deployed to bring heritage to life.

We saw this meeting as the start of a process, where initially our agenda included:

1. The consultee status of civic societies
2. Supplementary Planning Documents (or whatever might replace them)
3. Design Codes – making them locality specific
4. Local Lists
5. Strategic policies for developer contributions
6. Conservation Areas

On 14 May, our planning group members walked the Market Place conservation area and the upper part of Friarwood Valley Gardens with Emma Sharpe, conservation officer in order to start building positive relationships with the council team, whilst improving our understanding of current planning policy.

The three are Karen, Stacey and Rhona; lots of artistic talent in Pontefract. Well done!








